New Member Class



The Legacy Fund - Celebrate UMW! 150 Years and Counting...

The Legacy Fund is a permanent endowment with generated income that will enable United Methodist Women to distribute grants and scholarships, coordinate work with Mission personnel and make upgrades to the communication systems.

The fund was established as the organization looks forward to its 150^{th} anniversary. To date \$19.6 million has been raised toward the \$60 million goal.

On March 23rd, 1869, eight women gathered in Boston to found the Women's Foreign Missionary Society which would today become the United Methodist Women. Those women raised money to send a doctor, Clara Swain, and a teacher, Isabella Thoburn, to India as missionaries to serve the women in that nation.

For nearly 150 years, United Methodist Women have become the largest women's faith-based service organization, providing life changing opportunities for women, children and youth.

A couple of weeks ago, I came across some boxes that I had collapsed following our move last summer. I had placed them on a shelf believing that one day they would be used again for some reason. Realizing that it was now 8 months later, I knew it was safe and prudent to send them to the happy recycling center in the sky. Quickly, I moved them from shelf to recycling container.

Just like those who followed Jesus around during his earthly ministry, whether you be Pharisee or newbie, they spent much of the time trying to keep the Messiah in a preconceived box they thought he fit in. Jesus never intended to fit into a box that we have built for him. He always could be found outside the box doing what God the Father had sent him to do, by showing unconditional love and to guide us back to Him.

One of the beautiful results of Easter is that the box, in which they placed the body of Jesus, is empty. For me this means Jesus won't fit into a box of beliefs that I may choose to place him in. Those who took Jesus down from the cross and placed him in the grave must have thought this was the right thing to do. We do it even today when we bury our loved one and friends. But Jesus, conquered death in His resurrection power.

Because He conquered death nothing can confine him in a way in which we can fully comprehend. So, what do I mean by that? Well here comes my best explanation. It comes from the Scriptures, "Why are looking for the living among the dead?" As post-resurrection people the first place we want to tell others about Jesus is from our perspective. We often start with the Jesus in the manger so meek and mild. But, people need to hear about the Jesus who has changed our lives and made us whole. People need to hear about the times when we didn't recognize it was Jesus who was in our midst, challenged our understanding and in the breaking of the bread we suddenly recognized it was Him.

Recently, the parsonage was "egged" by some of our youth. No damage was done and the only thing required of me was to clean up from the episode. I waited a day because I wanted the neighbors to see what had transpired in the 'hood'. So, after a windy day had helped to scatter some of the colored eggs across the yard, I went to work to pick them all up. One of the first ones I came to was open and upon close inspection I found there was nothing on the inside. Other eggs contained something because when I shook them, there was a small familiar noise that I knew meant candy was the reward.

Like most Christians, we recognize that the empty Easter egg is a reminder that the grave is empty and Jesus is alive! Well, the time is now for us to remember the true meaning of Easter. AND to shout it from the square, from the rooftops, from our homes, automobile, and especially in church. We serve a Risen Savior and he is in the world today. I know that he is living whatever foes may say...He Lives!

Jesus can't be contained in a simple box or a grave. He is alive in your heart and mine.

Proclaim the name of Jesus! Take that box you and I have kept him in and take it to a recycler near you. You won't be needing it ever again because Jesus is alive!
