Colombia Missions 2020

Brisas Del Mar, San Onofre, Colombia Help Hannah Molina Make a Difference Abroad – July 11-18

Twenty-five years ago, the small village of Brisas del Mar, Colombia suffered a population deficit due to the hands of drug cartels. Because of this tragedy, an entire generation has been missing from this community. Grandparents are raising twenty year olds, and the twenty year olds are raising the children and infants. The Colombian Methodist Church has paired up with other Methodist churches to provide refuge for these families. The Colombian Church takes part in organizing the schools, medical clinic, and providing a feeding program for the students.

High School students from the Armstrong Chapel Church in Ohio, along with our church member, Hannah Thomas Molina, will be traveling a week to help construction on the local church and school, work within the clinic, and spread the ministry with the Brisas del Mar community.

All donations will be used to help fund the construction material, travel expenses and equipment needed in the local clinics. Checks can be made to Hannah Molina or she has a "Go Fund Me" page.



Long before I was born my Grandmother Horn made a quilt for each of her grandchildren. She made eight. I was the first-born grandchild of what would one day become – you guessed it, eight grandchildren.

For many years, that quilt was used on Chris and my bed. That is until one day we began to notice that in places it was becoming frayed. Not wanting to see it become further damaged, we put it away for safekeeping while trying to figure out how to take the necessary steps to make it usable again.

Our denomination has become so frayed over the years that we are in danger of no longer continuing as UNITED Methodist. We can't place the denomination into a container for safekeeping and only pull it out for special occasions. The Church of Jesus Christ must always function in the daily lives of the people.

I have heard of as many as nine (9) possible proposals to the upcoming General Conference (May 2020) that may formally lead us to become separate denominations. Some of the proposals are coming from very diverse theological groups that in the past worked hard, very hard at trying to form a compromise around the issue of human sexuality that has not been resolved for the last 40 years.

Where does this lead us as a local congregation known as United Methodist Church?

We may have to make a decision about our direction such as which option will we follow? There may be, depending on which plan as amended is adopted, the choice to be known as a traditional church, a progressive church, or a centrist church. That as of today appears to be our possible options. What those three options mean I will try and give you a brief description. Because at this point in time all these options will remain just proposals which are subject to change through the legislative process of General Conference.

First, and in no order of importance is the traditional option. It would retain the current wording in our Book of Discipline regarding human sexuality. Which states that pastors in open, same sex relations will not be ordained. Pastors will also not be permitted to perform same sex weddings, either in the church or at some other location. Those that do will be subject to charges and possible loss of clergy credentials.

Next, the progressive option would eliminate all prohibition against same sex marriages being officiated either in our churches or at any location by UM clergy. It would also eliminate the language about clergy being in same sex relations. Part of the proposal may also lead to an exit strategy for some congregations who feel they may no longer 'fit' into the United Methodist Church.

Also, another proposal, and one that seems at least to me somewhat extreme is the advocation of the denomination splitting into four (4) distinct theologically centered churches all while remaining under the United Methodist umbrella. Meaning we would still have our general church agencies such as UMCOR, Discipleship Ministries, Wespath and other agencies.

Where may that leave us? Great question.

With several of these proposals allowing for local congregations to have and/or make an exit either entirely from a new United Methodist Church or aligning ourselves with a new form of the denomination it becomes incumbent that we prepare for any and all possibilities. So, this is what I am taking steps to do to see that we as the Colona UMC are as prepared as we can be come next May.

I have asked several of our folks to begin to meet and at this time discuss these current proposals. These proposals are the ones that will considered since the deadline for any legislative items passed on September 18th. While I have asked a group of folks to be part of this process that does not mean what we are doing is being done in private or secret. Anyone who wishes to be part of the discussion is certainly welcome to attend any or all the gatherings. I will make certain each of our gatherings are publicized as to meeting time and place. Your input is always valued.

Our denomination is frayed, and we are reminded that you 'can't pour new wine into old wineskins.' God is always doing a new thing. It may be that we have reached a new time. The One who can take a remnant and turn it into something new is at work among us today as well as yesterday and certainly tomorrow.
