
### **Church Wide Advent Study**

## **Junior Choir**



#### **Trustees News**

Thanks to all who continue to help keep the church looking good. Now that we have had a bit of rain maybe, we can get some grass growing in our recent dirt work areas. If you notice a maintenance issue, the Trustees need to address, please write it down and put it in the Trustees mailbox.

Only the middle section of the Narthex lighting is turned off and on by motion sensors so the right hand wall switch needs to be left in the "on" position, please do not turn it off when you leave. Those lights will automatically go off after about 10 minutes. The right hand switch as well as all other lights need to be off when you depart. Also, we need to be aware of the traffic flow past the front entrance. Handicapped parking will be along the north or building side of the drop off lane and traffic needs to flow east to west through the lane. This is a safety issue as the brick columns block the visibility of those exiting the building. Thanks for your assistance.
